DRAMA 3330 Costume Design for the Performing Arts Spring 2005

This course explores planning and design of performance costumes, including skills such as drawing, painting, production and play analysis. Writing, drawing, painting, research, reading and discussion of production are included in the work of this class.

#### REQUIREMENTS

Always bring a pencil and paper to class. You will also need note taking supplies.

#### SUPPLIES

You will need various items depending on your own work. You may need Xeroxes, tape, clips, craft supplies and you might want to experiment with a variety of paper and paints. You will need:

- Pencil, eraser, sketch paper,
- Paintbrushes (1-4 and 6-10)
- Watercolor paper, watercolor paints, water container, clean-up supplies,
- Fabric/trims, glue, staples, mattboard.
