Students may choose from this list of core courses for their electives. All electives must be approved by the program director.

Relevant courses from other departments can be selected to fulfill core course requirements with approval from the Program Director. Examples of such courses include: PADP 7210 – Introduction to the Nonprofit Sector: Theory and Practice; PADP 7900 – Managing Volunteers in the Public and Nonprofit Sectors.

MNML 7010 is the program's catch-all course for any special course that is not offered on a regular basis. Although the course number is the same, the course title and instructor will vary from section and semester.
